## The Gordon F. Henderson Human Rights Scholarship 2012

The Human Rights Research and Education Centre (HRREC) is offering a scholarship of \$17,500. This initiative is to promote research in the area of human rights. The scholarship will be paid in three equal installments over a period of one year. It is available for a Canadian or international student entering the first year of Masters studies in Law (LL.M.) or the first or second year of Masters studies in the Social Sciences (M.A.) at the University of Ottawa and whose area of research is human rights.

Candidates must have received full-time admission to the Masters program at the Faculty of Law or a Masters program at the Faculty of Social Sciences of the University of Ottawa. The candidate must demonstrate a significant interest in human rights which will be evident from her or his personal, professional and/or academic experience. Candidates are invited to consult the HRREC website in order to demonstrate in their application how they can contribute to the research activities of the Centre.

Value of award: \$17,500

Number of annual awards: One, non-renewable

Level of award: Masters

Candidates must submit:

- A cover letter confirming your eligibility and outlining your interest in human rights. This letter should also explain how you envisage contributing to the activities of the HRREC; (5 pages maximum)
- Original transcripts, or copies of transcripts if you have already included official transcripts in your submission for admission to a Masters program at the University of Ottawa;
- A summary description of your thesis topic; (2 pages maximum)
- A current curriculum vitae.
